Student Characteristics

ESL/ELD

Designed for early language learners

Oral English

Conversational English

Language, plus content
(when possible)

- Most are recent arrivals to the US
- English is not home language (L1)
- May or may not have academic skills in L1

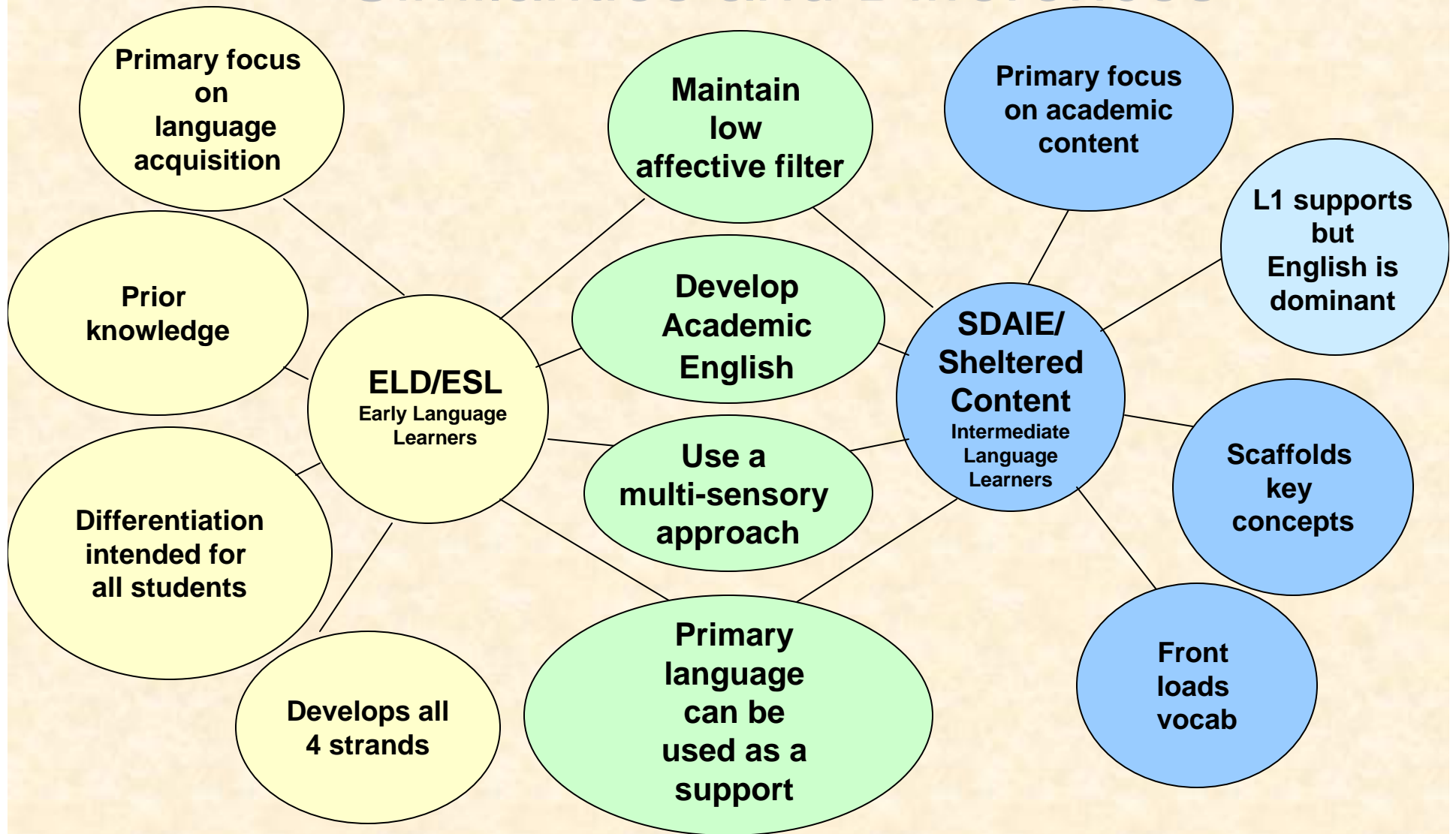
Sheltered Content Instruction

Designed for intermediate language learners

Academic language in content

- Approaching redesignation
- Some born in US homes where English is not L1, some born outside of US

ELD and SDAIE Lessons: Similarities and Differences



*The Fundamental Difference Between **ELD/ESL** and **SDAIE/Sheltered***

ELD/ESL students are learning how to listen, speak, read, and write in Academic English.

SDAIE/Sheltered students are using Academic English skills in reading, writing, listening, speaking to learn content.

Develop Academic English
