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## **ABSTRACT**

Standing firmly on the review of the relevant literature which shows that parent involvement, even to the extent of homeschooling, is not a new phenomena in the world of education, this study began with the premise that some parents can and will choose to take full responsibility of their child(ren)'s education by homeschooling.
