1.	Good eye contact

clearly.	
5.	Main points are discussed.
6.	Best part of the paper is discussed, giving
reasons of	f support.
7.	Lesson learned (that researcher didn't
already know) is discussed.	
8.	Problems, frustrations, surprises, etc. are
discussed	
9.	Audience and teacher's questions are
adequately	y answered.
10.	Researcher is clearly knowledgeable
about topic	c and presents with style, wit, and interest.
