Activity Center 4: ESL and Sheltered Challenging Activity (CA) or Complex Thinking (CT) ***Teach Complex Thinking, Challenging Students Toward Cognitive Complexity***

The Teacher

- emphasizes the whole picture to understand the parts
- designs instructional tasks that advance student understanding to more complex levels
- promotes more complex understanding by relating instruction to students' real-life experience
- gives clear, direct feedback about how students' performance relates to standards

ESL and Sheltered Content Instruction are often confused. In addition, they often have synonyms, which mean almost the same. Look at the graphic on the left side of this folder. Discuss the differences and similarities between the methods and the needs of the students.

The *task* for your group: On two different transparencies, brainstorm the attributes of ESL and the attributes of sheltered content instruction. Inside of each circle, also you need to write as many synonyms as possible. Attributes on the outside; synonyms on the inside.
